- works with the professional game by offering advice and guidance on all aspects of race equality within professional football.

As a group the single most important thing we feel we have achieved is the creation of the REDsection at the Emirates Stadium. Although there have been teething problems with the section we have liaised with the club fully and hopefully we can go on to create something that will provide enjoyment for fans and great levels of support for the team.
